UV Protection with Contact Lenses

Quality sun wear is a must for our Hawaii climate and outdoor lifestyles.

Thanks to consumer initiatives about skin cancer, most people know the importance of sun screen use when exposed to the sun's ultraviolet rays. But, what about your eyes? Did you know that UV exposure can also damage your eyes? Long term UV exposure can contribute to cataracts, macular degeneration, pterygium, pinguecula, and photokeratitis (ie. sunburn of the cornea).



Some contact lens brands can provide UV protection for the cornea and lens (although sunglasses are still recommended for coverage of the entire eye). The Acuvue line of contact lenses, made by Vistakon, blocks 90% of UV-A and 99% of UV-B rays. Acuvue lenses are available to correct near-sightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, and presbyopia (the need for reading glasses). UV blocking contact lenses also offer the advantage of helping protect against light from striking the eyes from the sides. For outdoor sports which are not conducive to wearing sunglasses, these contacts are a nice option.

More is better when it comes to protecting your eyes from the sun. If you are planning to be out in the sun, protect your eyes with a combination of quality sunglasses, UV-blocking contact lenses, and a wide-brimmed hat.



The Visian ICL, a Better Option Than LASIK?

Staying on the forefront of state-of-the-art surgical technology, Dr. Jeff Wong is now offering the Visian ICL. A newer type of vision correction surgery, it's now available for people who are moderate to severely near sighted. The difference with Visian is that the correction is accomplished with a lens instead of a laser, and is much like a contact lens that goes inside the eye rather than on the outside. It is placed right behind the colored iris and in front of the natural lens in a short outpatient procedure.

The main difference between the Visian and LASIK is that LASIK removes tissue from the cornea that can never be replaced, permanently altering its shape. In contrast, the

Visian leaves the cornea pristine. In fact, the Visian is a reversible procedure and can be removed in the rare event that it needs to

Because the cornea is untouched, the quality of vision with the Visian is often much better than with LASIK. Many consider the vision with the Visian to be "HD" quality. The stability of the vision with the Visian is much better than with LASIK, and there is less chance of needing a "touch-up" with the Visian. And because there is no disruption or severing of corneal nerves with the Visian, it will not cause or exacerbate dry eye like LASIK often does.

If you are between the ages of 21 and 45 and nearsighted, you may be an excellent candidate for the Visian. Unlike LASIK, the Visian is able to safely and effectively treat patients with thin corneas, dry eyes and patients with very high refractive errors. In fact, many patients who are not candidates for LASIK turn out to be ideal Visian candidates.



Are 3D Video Games Bad for Young Eyes?

Many kids yearn for the new three dimensional video games under the Christmas tree this year. Yet some parents



may be concerned because Nintendo and other manufacturers have posted warnings advising parents against allowing children younger than 6 years old to play

the new generation of 3D video games. Eye strain, eye fatigue or symptoms of nausea are all listed in the health and safety precautions of the Nintendo 3DS, 3D TV manufacturer, Samsung, cautions "Children and teenagers may be more susceptible to health issues associated with viewing in 3D."

The good news is that these warnings are being overly cautious. It is true that the development of the visual system in young kids is extremely sensitive until 10 years old. This is due to the continuous formation of the nerve connections between the brain and the eyes when they are young. Children need clear images to foster the growth of these

connections, which is why it is important to treat such conditions as lazy eye and glasses early. However, there is no scientific evidence that video games, 3D or otherwise, inhibits the growth of these brain connections.

A small subset of children may have difficulty viewing 3D video games or movies because of any underlying eye abnormality causing strain on the

focusing and visual coordination system. These children may experience headaches or nausea and should have a comprehensive eye examination by a pediatric ophthalmologist. Though the video games themselves are not



harmful to young eyes, there are many other reasons to limit the amount of time your child plays video games. Parents should use good judgement in permitting their children to play video games, encouraging frequent breaks when necessary.
